POSITION:

Teacher Regular Grades, Teacher Special Education, Teacher Trainer Save for College Program Teaching and Learning Support Up to 33 positions available Office of Student Pathways Work supervisor: Sabine Maura, Senior Director, External Partnerships

The NYC Kids RISE Save for College Program is a scholarship and savings program designed to make college and career training more accessible for all NYC public school students—regardless of family income or immigration status.

The Office of Student Pathways oversees the programmatic components of the Save for College program. As part of the 2021 Juneteenth Economic Justice Plan, the City announced the expansion of the Save for College Program to all kindergarten students enrolled in over 1,000 NYC Public Schools (including participating charter schools) starting September 2021. To respond to additional capacity needs the Office of Student Pathways is hiring facilitators to engage school staff and/or students at regular per session rate, after regularly scheduled school hours, for the Save for College team. Specific work dates and times to be mutually agreed upon.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

NYC Department of Education licensed and appointed Teacher Trainers (TT), and Teachers (Regular Grades or TR)

SELECTION CRITERIA:

- At least two (2) years of satisfactory (Highly Effective/Effective) experience working within the NYCDOE.
- Licensed and appointed DOE teacher, teacher trainer;
- Passionate, reflective, and collaborative educator who has a positive impact on student learning.
- Effective and engaging communicator. Excellent interpersonal, customer service, and follow-up skills.
- Interest in expanding post-secondary readiness efforts and access.
- Strong computer skills, including comfort with Microsoft Office, Google Workspace, and learning new technologies.
- Ability to articulate lived experiences as a NYC public school teacher, with aspects of Save for College program details in a compelling way.

DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES:

Responsibilities may include content design, session facilitation, enrichment instruction and/or feedback as outlined below.

• Design engaging, adapted professional learning sessions and/or enrichment sessions for students and/or parents/guardians, outside of the regularly scheduled school day, to meet school/district/region specific contexts in consultation with SFC program team.

- Facilitate engaging, adapted professional learning sessions for school staff and/or program support or enrichment sessions for students and/or parents/guardians, outside of the regularly scheduled school day, to meet school/district/region specific contexts. The staff offerings will include synchronous curriculum sessions for teachers, synchronous curriculum sessions for school administrators, OR synchronous milestone specific workshops for school-based staff.
- Facilitate synchronous Save for College Program specific sessions via online meeting platform or in person.
- Demonstrate effective techniques to increase session engagement and outcomes.
- Adhere to facilitator script and talking points, and continually hone talking points derived from user data and check-ins with SFC team throughout a facilitation season.
- Student sessions will include enrichment connected to financial literacy.
- Provide detailed feedback on content, professional learning and/or financial literacy implementation.
- Following each session, report back to SFC Senior Director
 - Marketing methods
 - Session registration
 - Session Attendance (including first name, last name, title, DBN)
 - Audience questions
 - Poll results

Summary of Chancellor's Regulation C-175

Chancellor's Regulation C-175 is available for review at https://www.schools.nyc.gov/about-us/policies/chancellors-regulations. Each school maintains a copy of the Standard Operating Procedures Manual for Schools (SOPM). Individuals may review a copy of these procedures in order to familiarize themselves with the process by which per session employees are processed and paid.

- 1. All per session employees must complete an application for per session activity (OP175) prior to commencing service.
- 2. Individuals who have been approved for waivers in prior years must resubmit new waiver applications each year. For this purpose, the per session year is from July 1 *through* June 30.
- 3. Individuals must submit a waiver form for exceeding the limit on the maximum number of hours that can be served in a per session year. The maximum number of hours of per session work that may be performed annually is available in the C-175 regulation.
- 4. No individual is authorized to work in a per session activity during a normal school workday.
- 5. Per session employment, whether funded from the same or a different source, may not be used as a means of providing additional compensation for work similar to that which is performed in an individual's primary assignment.
- 6. Individuals cannot serve in a per session activity for which, in their primary assignment, they are responsible for hiring, rating, or coordinating or which they normally supervise in their primary assignment.
- 7. No per session compensation may be paid for work performed at home.
- 8. Employees on sabbatical leaves beginning August 1 must complete per session activities in which they are serving in July. They will not be permitted to commence any new per session assignments until the September following the completion of the sabbatical.
- 9. Each per session employee is required to use a time clock to record the exact time of arrival and departure. The timecard is to be maintained at the work site and should serve as the basis of entries on the Personnel Time Report. If a time clock is not available, a daily attendance report with exact time of arrival and departure must be provided, maintained and approved by a supervisor. In every case, regardless of the specific manner in which time is reported, supervisors are accountable for verifying the record of attendance. Approval by a co-worker is not acceptable. Failure to maintain satisfactory records will result in the withholding of compensation or recoupment of payment already made.
- 10. Each per session employee is required to submit a time sheet for service that was performed during the prior per session period within one school day of the per session period immediately following each service.
- 11. Time sheets submitted for per session work which required a waiver that was not previously approved will result in the withholding of per session payment.
- 12. If a teacher is entitled to retention rights in a per session activity but fails to claim those rights before or at the time of application for a different per session job in which the teacher has no retention rights, the teacher may then be denied employment in the job for which there is entitlement to retention.

Notes: Requests for waivers must be submitted sufficiently in advance to allow time for review and appropriate action. Failure to obtain a valid waiver may result in the withholding of payment for hours worked beyond the maximum hours as outlined in Chancellor's Regulation C-175.
